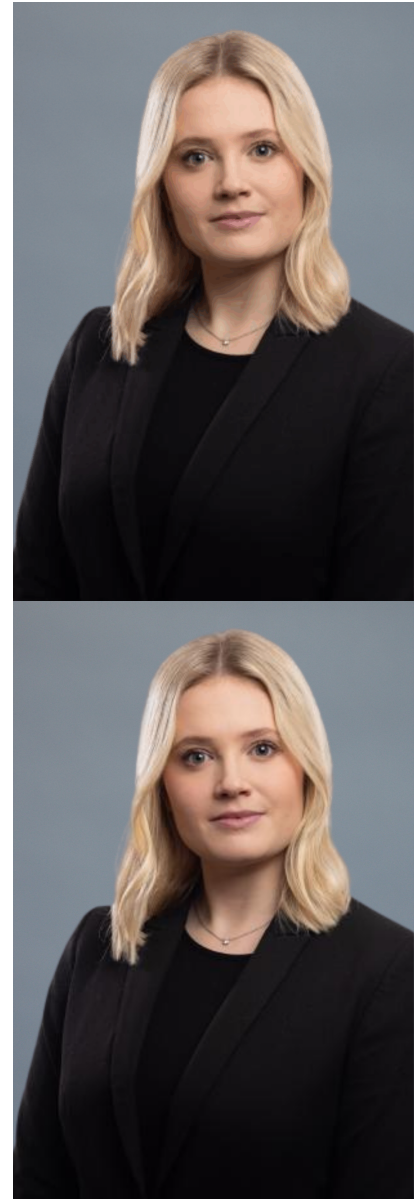

Experience

Tabitha welcomes instructions in all areas of family law and has a particular interest in Children Act proceedings involving allegations of alienation and domestic abuse, as well as relocation matters. Prior to joining the Bar, she undertook a number of voluntary roles centred around supporting women and children during times of familial conflict, with a focus on victims in the IRC population who had been subject to domestic or gendered violence.

Tabitha has previous experience as a teacher and tutor and is committed to platforming the voices and wellbeing of children and young people. She continues this work with Barristers in Schools, offering talks and workshops to young people.

Public

Tabitha accepts instructions in prison and parole board matters; discrimination matters and criminal or immigration related public law. As a practitioner with a multidisciplinary background, she is also well placed to act in civil actions against public authorities. She has experience acting in claims against the MOJ, private prisons and the police.
